# CROPS,

They have gone! The screaming acrobatic display has left our skies as our swifts returned to Africa catching insects on the wing as they went - not landing again until they nest back with us next spring. The thousands of miles travelled in a lifetime of this small bird are phenomenal and their need for a continuous supply of insects equally so.

Most birds including swifts. swallows and house martins all have the capacity to store food in their crop as a ball called a bolus before swallowing it for themselves or feeding it to young ones. The crop is an extension of the oesophagus before it reaches the glandular stomach and is an expandable sac. The crop of seed eating birds will be larger than that of insectivorous ones and as birds have no teeth, those that eat very hard seeds or fruit have the assistance of another organ called the gizzard which mechanically grinds and mixes the birds' feed.

The gizzard is found after the main stomach and will grind food before passing it back to the stomach for further processing. Some birds pick up tiny stones and grit which help this process acting like the birds' 'teeth'. Whilst all birds have gizzards not all birds have crops. The birds that do not have crops are owls and waterfowl like ducks and geese. Birds are not the only animals to possess gizzards. Crocodilians like crocodiles and alligators have them as do some of their

ancestors the dinosaurs. Mullet fish have gizzards as does the richly coloured trout called the **Gillaroo** which can be found in Lough Melvin in the North of Ireland and which

uses its gizzard to help digest water snails - a main component of their diet. Some crustaceans also have a form gizzard normally referred to as a gastric mill. So the need to reduce food into smaller more manageable pieces is solved evolutionary

developments - in humans (and apes etc) by having teeth to chew the food and mix with digestive juices in the saliva and in birds by having a gizzard and/or a crop.

Surprisingly, earthworms also use a gizzard as part of their digestive system. In the 8th segment, the oesophagus dilates and modifies into a large, muscular oval shaped gizzard occupying 8th and 9th segments. The gizzard is made of circular muscles and is internally lined by a cuticle. There are chitinous teeth. It acts as a grinder which crushes the food material. After the gizzard, the food is pushed to the intestine where it is finally broken down into simpler compounds.

The recent rain after the

drought in June has improved the ground for the many worms that populate the meadow. Most simply burrow more deeply during dry spells but there has been a distinct lack of those

more surface dwellers
which are the main
food source of
birds such as

thrushes and blackbirds.
Their decline in numbers is very worrying.

A g a i n there are moments that counteract the rather depressing statistics overall. As

I walked the site with my American grandchildren yesterday we were pleasantly surprised to be amongst a significant number of beautiful comma butterflies. These lovely burnt orange coloured masters of the air were circling around us and landing briefly in the sunshine before finding a potential mate and taking off into the air to dance and flutter around each other in a mating dance. They have wing edges that are sculpted and are fast flyers.

We spotted ladybirds of varying sizes and colour combinations on a number of the plants and the thistles lining the edge of the wetland had a selection of bumble bees busy burying their respective heads in the purple blooms to extract as much nectar as possible.

GIZZARDS!

The scent of honey wafted over the grass from the lady's bedstraw which is in full bloom with its feathery yellow flowers on tall spikes. The blue/purple meadow cranesbill is spreading across all the meadow flower areas and it has retreated from others as the more dominant plants take over. The fact that the range of plants and their location changes is part of the pleasure of the site.

The wetland is white with meadowsweet blossom on short bushy plants. This has moved in recently from elsewhere on the site and will no doubt over time be replaced by other species. Meadowsweet's most famous claim to medicinal success is as a forerunner of aspirin as it contains salicylic acid. It was considered the go-to herb for indigestion, flatulence, gastric ulcers, gastric reflux, liver disorders, cystitis, diarrhoea in children, rheumatism, cellulitis, bladder stones, and oedema. It has to be taken in moderation as it thins the blood - but meanwhile is a source of sweet scent and food for many insects. So despite the drought and the recent downpours of rain the reserve is adjusting and looks beautiful.

Enjoy walking down there and relish these summer days if you can.


# **Duffield Parliament Week – Your Village, Your Say**

# YOUR GREEN COUNCILLORS IN DUFFIELD

Your County Councillor, Gez Kinsella, has many people contacting him about issues with roads and pavements. Gez recently helped some Duffield residents their pavement resurfaced. Meadow Vale resident, Laura Harward said, "After my attempts to get something done about the state of the pavement were unsuccessful. Gez took up the case. I was very impressed with how Gez kept in touch with me throughout and ensured Derbyshire County Council got the job done."

Gez says, "I understand that issues such as potholes and poor pavement conditions are a constant problem for Duffield residents. The most efficient way of resolving such issues is by reporting direct to the Highways Department at Derbyshire County Council. If this doesn't get the problem solved then please contact me so I can intervene on your behalf."

Recent local elections saw an amazing five Green Party town councillors elected on to Belper Town Council. They are currently working hard on an important issue that will affect residents of Duffield who visit Belper. Manv Duffield residents currently park for free in the

Coppice car park – the large car park behind the Market Place. Government legislation means Belper Town Council now has to pay £22,000 a year in business rates for this car park. The Town Council are currently deciding what to do. Should the money be raised by charging motorists or kept free, diverting funds from other projects?

The Green Party knows it is really important to listen to the views of as many people as possible to enable the council to make the best decsion for the town and its visitors. They are currently surveying visitors to the town to get a better understanding of the impact of introducing charges. Councillor Alison Mc Dermott says, "As many Duffield residents are regular visitors to Belper we would really like to hear your opinions. During the 1971 Morecambe and Wise Christmas Show, Eric Morecambe, OBE, when speaking of his piano playing during a performance of Edvard Grieg's piano concerto in A minor, told a somewhat disappointed Andre Previn, pianist, composer and principal conductor of the London Symphony Orchestra, "I'm playing all the right notes, but not necessarily in the right Wednesday coffee order". mornings at the Weston Centre (10-12) offer an opportunity to hear piano performances from three inspiring people in later life whose abilities, with and without sheet music, ensure an audience hear all the right notes in the right order. One of those musicians. David Cox (90), told me about his desire to play the piano and his life-long interest in music.

DC: David Cox

PW - At what age did your love for music begin?

DC - I had piano lessons from the age of eight and soon took part in

concerts during the Blitz, raising money for the War effort. I also had singing lessons and became a boy chorister at Westminster Abbey but withdrew when my voice broke at the age of fifteen. Music is my life and I always approach performances with professionalism and adequate preparation.

PW - What do you aim to achieve from your performances?

DC - I want to provide enjoyment and make people happy and smile. There is too much conflict, unhappiness and disappointment in the world.

PW - Do people sing along to your playing and which tunes attract audience participation?

DC - Yes, they do. They like the old favourites which evoke memories. I play, 'All the nice girls love a sailor', 'I do like to be beside the seaside', 'When you're smiling', 'Somebody stole my gal' and many more.

PW - Are there pianists you admire?

DC - Yes there are. I like big band pianists including Oscar

Peterson, Duke Ellington and Count Basie. I admire Harry M. Woods because he was born with a deformed left hand and also like his compositions including 'Side by side' and 'Try a little tenderness'. Lastly I like Thelonious Monk's style of playing. I've been a long follower of traditional jazz: its history and performers.

Whilst living in Kent, David played the piano for a local amateur drama group's production of a pantomime, and in Duffield accompanied a tap dancer adding the benefits of tacet to the performance.
